





- 3.6) Did you find this module sufficiently challenging? Please give comments below:
- Although not the most challenging module, do believe its core purpose is to get everyone to understand what may seem like a foreign subject. Not everyone wants to go into markets, so making it unnecessarily mathsy would have been aimless. I believe this class conveyed a correct amount of knowledge.
- I do find the questions shown in the revision weeks a bit more difficult than the questions in previous weeks. Overall the course sounds easy, but actually not. I mean it is not challenging to understand the lectures, but it is quite difficult to do the exercises.

I even think it is more valuable in understanding Black Sholes and other processes because we don't look at the math side of things but pure understanding.
